## **Nevada Medicaid Web Announcement 3797**

### **Medicaid Services Manual Chapters Updated**

The following Medicaid Services Manual (MSM) chapters have been updated and posted on the Nevada Health Authority (NVHA) website:

- MSM Chapter 3800 – Medication Assisted Treatment (effective November 26, 2025)

Revisions to Medicaid Services Manual (MSM) Chapter 3800—Medication Assisted Treatment were implemented to change references from Division of Health Care Financing and Policy (DHCFP) to Nevada Medicaid, to align policy to Senate Bill (SB) 494, add language to align the definition of medication assisted treatment (MAT) to SB 300 and to more accurately meet Division criteria, and language was added to require MAT providers to offer all Federal Drug Administration (FDA)-approved medications for opioid use disorders (MOUD) on-site or facilitate access to MAT off-site.

Revisions to Medicaid Services Manual (MSM) Chapter 4100—Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services and Coverage were implemented to change references from Division of Health Care Financing and Policy (DHCFP) to Nevada Medicaid throughout the policy to align with Senate Bill (SB) 494, to clarify requirements for mental health treatment in a substance use treatment clinic: Registered Nurse (RN) was added to the list of providers who can perform substance use treatment, language was added to require residential treatment providers to offer all Food Drug Administration (FDA) approved medications for opioid use disorder (MOUDs) on site or facilitate access to Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) off site, language was added to clarify discharge criteria for residential and inpatient levels of care (LOC), and language was added to define continued service criteria and transition of care standards.
